

Two Drives to Consider

- 1. Pace (or Motor)
 - ✓ Relates to...
 - Speed
 - Intensity
 - Engagement
 - ✓ Outgoing: *Faster* Pace
 - ✓ Reserved: <u>Slower</u> Pace

Outgoing/Fast-paced




Reserved/Slower-paced

 - ✓ Relates to...
 - Direction
 - Focus
 - ✓ Task-oriented
 - Data
 - Results
 - People-oriented
 - Emotions
 - Relationships




DISC Model Key Words

Inspiring Interactive Influencing




Cautious Careful Consistent

Relative vs. Absolute Measurement

Turn left is relative.



Turn north is absolute.

Relative vs. Absolute Measurement

A big house is big relative to other houses.



Big



relative to...

Small

Relative vs. Absolute Measurement

 A house with 4000 square feet is an absolute measurement.



100 ft x 20 ft x 2 levels

4000 sq. ft.

It's Relative, not Absolute!

 A high or low trait is high or low compared to other people who took the same assessment.

There is no absolute standard of DISC behaviors/perspectives/drives.


Dangers of Using the DISC Model

- Labeling vs. Observing
 - ✓ "John is a Dominant person" labels John.
 - ✓ "John has many dominant behaviors" and "John seems to have a Dominant perspective" are observations.

Assuming it tells you everything.






Natural Style Bar Chart


Natural Style Pie Chart




Graph Reading – Natural Style

- Your *Natural* comfort zone
 - ✓ "Internal"
 - ✓ How you see the world
 - ✓ Who you "are"
 - ✓ Reflects needs
 - ✓ Typically consistent across situations
- From "Least" answers
 - ✓ 24 at bottom
 - ✓ 0 at top




Graph Reading – Adapted Style

- How you Adapt to your environment
 - ✓ "External"
 - ✓ What others see
 - ✓ What you "do"
 - ✓ Reflects environment
 - Can change to fit situation
- From "Most" answers
 - O at bottom
 - ✓ 24 at top








